 The delegitimizing of Babylon's gods, in the experience of the Israelites in Exile led to the delegitimizing of the Empire as a whole. Chapter 46 leads right into 47.

 A likely reflection of the need for empires or civilizations to have a foundation mythology. When the foundation myth is compromised, empires tend to fail. Myths can evolve though to accommodate new experiences of the people.



What is Isaiah 47 about?


A taunt with pathos? A scoffing song? A redemption oracle? A lament? A diatribe of a vengeful deity? An ancient consolation?

Brueggemann says it's really a fake lament for an enemy in order to console a people whose God they thought had abandoned them in a strange land.




Chapter 47 does not match this modern conception!






"Whoa, Donald—you're scaring me, man."

ISAIAH 47 TEXT

 Come down and sit in the dust, virgin daughter of Babylon!
 Sit on the ground without a throne, daughter Chaldea!
 For you shall no longer be called tender and delicate.

 2 Take the millstones and grind meal, remove your veil,
 strip off your robe, uncover your legs, pass through the rivers.

3 Your nakedness shall be covered, and your shame shall be seen.
I will take vengeance, and I will spare no one.

4 Our Redeemer—the Lord of hosts is his name — is the Holy One of Israel.

5 Sit in silence, and go into darkness, daughter Chaldea!
For you shall no more be called the mistress of kingdoms.

6 I was angry with my people, I profaned my heritage;
I gave them into your hand, you showed them no mercy;
on the aged you made your yoke exceedingly heavy.

7 You said, "I shall be mistress forever," so that you did not lay these things to heart or remember their end.

 But evil shall come upon you, which you cannot charm away;
 disaster shall fall upon you, which you will not be able to ward off;
 and ruin shall come on you suddenly, of which you know nothing.

12 Stand fast in your enchantments and your many sorceries, with which you have labored from your youth; perhaps you may be able to succeed, perhaps you may inspire terror.

 You are weared with your many consultations; let those who study the heavens
 stand up and save you, those who gaze at the stars,
 and at each moon predict

what shall befall you.

Such to you are those with whom you laboured, who have trafficked with you from your youth; they all wander about in their own paths; there is no one to save you.






I. Give an example of how language, poetry, art, or even humour can serve to unmask a 'principality or power' that's crossed the line?


It could be an empire 'out there' or an aspect of our false self 'in here'.






WHAT'S ANOTHER WAY TO UNMASK POWERS DAILY?
